Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end the Scottish showing season.



This year's show will be held at:

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse and pony placed 1st in all In Hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) and Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions and Reserves will qualify for the Champion and Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and <https://puddledub.entrymaster.online/>

Rules

- **Hard Hats** must be worn at all times when mounted including Novelty Classes.
- **Competitors responsibility** to ensure they are on time for their class. Classes will not be held up to allow for competitors to move between rings.
- **Classes will be closed** when in Ridden the class goes into trot or In Hand when last competitor has done their "Trot Round".
- **Risk:** Owners entering their horses do so entirely at their own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to Carnwath Agricultural Society. It is recommended Competitors have 3rd Party liability Insurance.
- **Classes:** The Organisers reserve the right to divide, cancel or amalgamate any class when deemed necessary.
- **Stallions and Colts** must be bitted and handled by a competent attendant over 16 years.
- **Stallions and colts** are only allowed in designated classes.
- **Control of animals:** Any competitor/owner who cannot adequately control their animal may be required to immediately leave the showground, on the direction of an Official. No refunds will be issued in respect of entries.
- **Parking:** Vehicles must be parked as directed. Any vehicles parked in unauthorised areas will be asked to leave the showground. No refunds will be given. Cars which are not attached to a trailer will not be allowed in the lorry park but will be directed to the public car park.
- **No exhibitor** may enter and compete an animal under a Judge who is known to have sold, bred or produced that animal.
- **No exhibitor** may enter or compete an animal under a Judge they have ridden for or had financial dealings with.
- **Lunging:** No animal should be lunged in the Showfield.
- **Warm up areas** are for ridden warm up only.

- **Animals** should remain in their lorries/trailers until going up in reasonable time for their class.
- **Dogs:** Dogs **must always be on a lead and under control** whilst on the Showground. Owners must clean up after their dogs.
- **Soundness:** All animals must be sound. If, in the opinion of any Judge, a horse or pony is considered to be unsound, the Competitor will be given the option of withdrawing from the class.

Ring 1 - Mountain and Moorland

Small Breeds – Shetland, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh Sec A, Welsh Sec B

Large Breeds – Fell, Dales, Highlands, Connemara, New Forrest, Welsh Sec C, Welsh Sec D

- 1 Stallions 4 years and over, in hand– all M&M Breeds
- 2 Colts 3 years and under, in hand – all M&M Breeds
- 3 M&M Small Breeds 3 years and under, In Hand – Mares and Geldings
- 4 M&M Large Breeds 3 years and under, In Hand – Mares and Geldings
- 5 M&M Small Breeds 4 years and over, in hand – Mares and Geldings
- 6 M&M Large Breeds 4 years and over, in hand – Mares and Geldings

**Mountain and Moorland In Hand Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 1-6 are eligible to compete**

Novice Ridden Classes – pony/rider partnership not to have won 1st to 3rd place at any affiliated show. All ponies to be ridden in a snaffle.

- 7 Novice Ridden - Small Breeds
- 8 Novice Ridden – Large Breeds
- 9 Open Ridden – Small Breeds
- 10 Open Ridden – Large Breeds

**Mountain and Moorland Ridden Championship.
1st and 2nd from classes 7-10 are eligible to compete**

- 11 M&M Lead Rein. Pony 12.0hh and under. Rider 9 and under. Lead Rein to be attached to noseband. Leader must be 16 years or older
- 12 M&M First Ridden Pony. Pony 12.2hh and under. Rider 12 years and under

**Mountain and Moorland Mini Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 11-12 are eligible to compete**

Championship winners and reserves go forward to the Overall Horse Championship to take place at finish of judging at approximately 1.30pm

Ring 1 (cont.)

- 13 Veteran In hand horse/pony In Hand (Horse/Pony to be 16 years and over)
- 14 Veteran Ridden Pony (Horse/Pony to be 16 years and over)

Veteran Horse/Pony Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 13-14 are eligible to compete

Championship winners and reserves go forward to the Overall Horse Championship to take place at finish of Judging at approximately 1.30pm

Ring 2 – Ponies

Judge – Miss Lauren Cohen

To be under 15hh. No Stallions and Colts allowed except in class 15

- 15 In hand youngstock 3 years and under – colts, filly or gelding
- 16 In Hand Pony
- 17 In Hand Coloured Pony
- 18 In Hand Pony of Cob type
- 19 In Hand Foreign Breed Pony

In Hand Pony Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 15-19 are eligible to compete

Ridden Pony

Ponies must not enter on lead rein and must be unaccompanied except in allocated classes

- 20 Nursery Novice Ridden Pony – Walk/Trot only. Rider any age, not to have been placed 1st–3rd in any Ridden Class
- 21 Novice Ridden Pony – Rider any age, not to have been placed 1st–3rd in any Open Ridden Class
- 22 Open Ridden Pony – Rider any age
- 23 Home Produced Ridden Pony – owner to live withing 15 miles of the showground and pony not to have been produced in a professional yard in last 12 months

Pony Ridden Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 20-23 are eligible to compete

- 24 Lead Rein Pony – rider 9 years and under. Pony 12hh and under. Lead rein to be attached to noseband. Leader must be 16 years or older
- 25 First Ridden Pony- rider 12 years and under. Pony 12.2hh and under
- 26 Junior Ridden Pony – rider 14 years and under. Pony 13.2hh and under
- 27 Junior Ridden Pony – rider 18 years and under. Pony not exceeding 148cm (14.2hh)

Mini/ Junior Pony Championship
1st and 2nd from classes 24-27 are eligible to compete

Championship winners and reserves go forward to the Overall Horse Championship to take place at finish of Judging at approximately 1.30pm

Ring 3 – Horses

Judge- Mr Andrew Bowie

To be 15hh and over

- 28 In Hand Youngstock Horse, 3 years and under - colts, fillies and gelding
- 29 In Hand Horse, 4 years and over
- 30 In Hand Coloured Horse, 4 years and over
- 31 In Hand Cob, 4 Years and over
- 32 In Hand Foreign Breed Horse, 4 years and over

In Hand Horse Championship

1st and 2nd from classes 28-32 are eligible to compete

- 33 Nursery Novice Ridden Horse - not to have been placed 1st-3rd in any ridden class before closing date of entry. Walk trot only
- 34 Novice Horse – not to have been placed 1st-3rd in any ridden class
- 35 Open Ridden Horse
- 36 Ridden Coloured Horse
- 37 ROR Ridden Horse
- 38 Ridden Foreign Breed
- 39 Home produced/Local ridden Horse. Owner to live within 15 miles of showground and horse not to have been produced in a professional yard in last 12 months

Ridden Horse Championships

1st and 2nd from classes 33 to 39 are eligible to compete

Championship winners and reserves go forward to the Overall Horse Championship to take place at finish of judging at approximately 1.30pm

SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP

Champion and Reserve from Mountain and Moorland, Veteran, Pony and Horse Sections are eligible

To be held when all judging is completed at approximately 1pm

Winner will be invited to join the parade of winning livestock in the main ring

Novelty Classes

Judge – Mrs Louise Robertson

To commence once the Overall Championship is completed at approximately 1.30pm. This time may be subject to change on the day

- 40 Young Handler (in hand). Handler 8 years and under. May be accompanied by an adult
- 41 Young Handler. Handler 9-12 years
- 42 Young Handler. Handler 13-16 years
- 43 Childs Ridden Pony. Rider 12 years and under. Pony any height. May be led
- 44 Childs ridden horse/pony. Rider 13-16 years
- 45 Prettiest Mare. Any height. Can be ridden or in hand
- 46 Handsomest Gelding. Any height. Can be ridden or in hand
- 47 Family Pony. Must be ridden by an adult (over 18) and Child (15 and under)
